

Mixed Construction & Demolition Waste List

Items Accepted in Mixed Construction & Demolition (C&D) Waste Loads

- Unpainted wood, untreated wood, painted wood and stained wood
- Oriented strand board (OSB), particle board and plywood
- Boards and palettes
- Vinyl flooring, linoleum, laminated wood, laminated flooring and carpet
- Vinyl siding, plastic and vinyl building materials
- Asphalt pavement, concrete floors and walls (free of reinforcing steel)
- Tubs, sinks, toilets and countertops
- Small amounts of drywall and asphalt shingles
- Wiring, screws & nails
- Built up roofing & built up glued wood sections
- Brush, stumps and root balls
- Pipe (plastic, metal) must be 8" or smaller
- Light fixtures (no PCB-containing ballasts)
- Bricks, mortar and concrete blocks
- Ceiling & floor tile (asbestos type not accepted)
- **Fibreglass insulation, styrofoam insulation and house wrap: must be in plastic bags, place in landfill disposal bin.** A mixed waste fee could apply if not removed.
- Windows (wooden & vinyl)
- Metal joiners, frames & structural components
- Structural building materials (iron, concrete, aluminium, composites, masonry & timber)
- Sawdust & wood chips



Items Not Accepted in Mixed C&D Waste Loads

As of July 1, 2023: **Creosote Timbers & Pressure-Treated Wood** will not be accepted in mixed C&D loads. These items must be unloaded into a separate bin.

- Bagged garbage, food waste & food packaging
- Recyclable containers, paper & cardboard
- Furniture, curtains, clothing & home decor
- Plastic film (clean or dirty)
- Creosote wood (railway ties, wharves) & power poles
- Large pieces pressure-treated wood (wharves)
- Large wooden spools
- Caulking and adhesive tubes
- Concrete with reinforced steel
- Tarpaulins & netting
- Boats of any size, wood or fibreglass
- Hazardous wastes: labelled hazardous items, paint, tars, adhesives & aerosols
- Pipe larger than 8" diameter
- Wood with steel plating
